


For the 2022 Motorfest, RACQ commemorated the Jaguar Centenary. 1922 however was actually the founding of the Swallow Sidecar Company by William Lyons and William Walmsley which later became Jaguar. The Jaguar marque featured extensively in promotion by the RACQ prior to and during the event. Newspaper articles featured Rod and Sue with their 1939 SS DropHead Coupe and the commemorative metal badge pictured a club member's red E-Type. As well on the day a photo booth was available for spectators to have their photo taken with Tony's freshly restored E-Type. Brisbane Register chairman Lloyd was interviewed on stage and enlightened the crowd with the history of Jaguar and details of the models on display. A separate filmed interview was also done with JDCQ President Di.

The JDCQ rose to the occasion with an excellent display of 60 Jaguars displayed under cover with comprehensive information on the evolution of the marque. Jaguar Drivers Club of Qld and Classic Jaguar Enthusiasts Club comprised most of the cars. The ages of cars on display ranged from 1936 to 2021 and included examples of almost every model produced by Jaguar. The oldest examples were the 1936 SS100 and the 1939 SS DHC. The most modern were a 2019 F-Pace and a 2021 F-Pace. Finalists for the judging of best British were Brian Barby's just restored 1958 XK150 DHC, Colin Galley's 1960 XK150S coupe and Rod and Sue Greasley's 1939 SS DHC with the latter taking the win. The judges' choice for best car of the show was deservedly awarded to Rod and Sue's beautifully prepared 1939 SS DHC.

Of course the success of events such as this does not happen without a tremendous amount of work by a very small number of club members. Someone has to prepare the parking layout, produce the information posters, liaise with RACQ, man the club information desk etc. etc. Sincere thanks must go to that small group. For some it is not just washing the car and turning up to enjoy the day.

RACQ of course deserve thanks for staging this event every year. The new venue is excellent and has none of the space problems of prior years. There is no entry fee for display vehicles and only \$2 for spectators with all funds going to the RACQ Foundation. When leaving the venue there were still large numbers of excited viewers lining the footpaths of the exit routes showing how much the event was appreciated.

SWALLOW SIDECAR CO AND COACHBUILDING


The Swallow Sidecar Company was founded on 4 September 1922 by two friends, William Walmsley and William Lyons . Both families lived in the same street in Blackpool, England. Walmsley had previously been making sidecars and bolting them onto reconditioned



motorcycles. Lyons had served his apprenticeship at Crossley Motors in Manchester before moving to Brown and Mallalieu as a junior salesman.

Lyons recognised the commercial potential and joined Walmsley. Together they obtained premises in Blackpool with the assistance of a £1,000 overdraft underwritten by their fathers. With a small team of employees they were able to begin commercial production of the motorcycle sidecars.

The company diversified in 1926, changing its name to the **Swallow Sidecar and Coachbuilding Company** and moved into the car coachwork business. The first car that Lyons and Walmsley

worked on was the Austin 7, a popular and inexpensive vehicle. Lyons had persuaded a dealer in



Bolton, Lancashire to supply him with an Austin 7 chassis and commissioned Cyril Holland, a coachbuilder from the Midlands, to create a distinctive, open tourer body.

The result was the 1927 Austin Seven Swallow. Priced at only £175, the Swallow, with its brightly coloured two-tone bodywork and the style of more expensive cars proved popular at a time of financial hardship for many. Soon after, a saloon version was produced: the Austin Seven Swallow Saloon.



In 1927 the "Sidecar" was dropped from the name, and it became

ny. The increasing demand for Swallows made




it necessary to move the company closer to the heart of the British car industry and so, in 1928, they moved to a part disused First World War munitions factory at Holbrook Lane, Coventry. Business continued to grow and in 1929 the company was sufficiently confident to go to the expense of taking a stand at the London Motor Show.

Three new Swallow models appeared in 1929, based on Standard, Swift, and Fiat chassis. Also in 1929 John Black and William Lyons realised a long standing dream and produced a one of a kind sports car, This "First" SS (Standard Swallow) was a sleek Boat Tail Roadster with a flowing, streamlined design and pointed to an obvious attempt at making a fast car, possibly with the

racing. This car is believed to have been shipped to Australia in the late 40s.

Lyons wanted to move away from just being a coachbuilder and reliance on other manufacturers'



chassis. He commissioned a custom chassis from the Standard Motor Company, fitted with either a 2 or 2.5 litre Standard engine. At the 1931 Motor Show he unveiled the S.S.1 coupé, a two-seater sports car with the designation SS 90 with six-cylinder engines and a smaller four cylinder version, the S.S.II. In 1933, the company took over the coachbuilder Holbrook Bodies at Holbrook Lane in Coventry for expansion .

SWALLOW SIDECAR CO AND SS "JAGUAR"

The continued success and expansion of the SS range resulted in the creation of the **S.S. Cars Ltd** motor company by Lyons in 1934. Walmsley, who did not share Lyons' ambitions, left the company at this time.

In October 1935 Lyons presented his first four-door sedan, for which the old side-valve Standard engine was replaced by the Harry Westlake designed push-rod overhead valve engine.

In the 2.5litre version, the new engine delivered 100hp compared to Standards 70 hp. To emphasise the power gain, the new model was named SS Jaguar. The six-cylinder high-performance engine was also used in a sports car, which was now almost capable of 100 mph (160 km / h) and therefore was called SS Jaguar 100.

Compared to similar cars from Bentley or Alvis these new SS models were very cheap, so that "Jaguar" from the beginning had the reputation of a particularly inexpensive sports sedan. Near the end of 1937, the 3.5 litre with 125 bhp was added, both in the sedan and in the sports car. At the same time a two-door convertible version was presented, the *Drophead Coupé*.



POST WWII JAGUAR SALOONS

With the commencement of war in 1939, SS Cars Ltd joined in the war effort along with most of Britain's industry and this meant the cessation of all production work, so that another car was not built until 1946. By the time peace was declared in 1945, Lyons and his team were well underway with their production schedule. Some months before the end of the war they had received a go-ahead from the government that they might revert to their peacetime production. After the Second World War, due to the unsavoury connotations of the SS intials, the company was renamed Jaguar Cars Ltd in 1945.

The Jaguar Saloon, retrospectively referred to as the **Mk IV** after the launch of the Mark V at the Earls Court Motor Show in 1948, was available with a 1.5 litre, 2.5 litre or 3.5 litre engine as a re-badged



version of the pre-war SS saloons launched in 1938. The post-War Jaguar models were distinguished from the pre-war models with a radiator badge that now reads 'Jaguar' and was accompanied by the engine size. The 'SS' badge had resided in the center of the rear bumper and was replaced by a 'J'. The cars now rested on 18-inch wire wheels as standard, with disc type wheels optional. Ace covers were also optional to fit over the wire centres, and the spinners for the wire wheels featured the new 'Jaguar' logo. A reported 11 952 cars were built over the 3 engine sizes.

In1948 Jaguar announced its first new post-war, stop-gap model, the **Mark V** , which would carry the company's fortunes for a couple of years. The main innovation was the adoption of



independent front suspension, conceived by Chief Engineer William Heynes.

The Mark V retained a stylistic link to the pre-war SS cars with classic William Lyons curves, but otherwise, it was completely new. The Mk IV title was given only to its precursor after the launch of the Mk V. Between 1946 to 1948, William Lyons viewed five prototype bodies with various chassis experiments, and upon arriving at a satisfactory design, it was known as 'Mark V' on internal documents.


