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Background

In most years Jaguar Clubs around Australia get together to celebrate all things Jaguar, a Jaguar National Rally. In 2025 it is the turn of NSW to host the Rally and Post Rally Tour, with Bathurst being the focus of the first 4 days of activities. Thereafter a 6-day tour will take place around Central West NSW.

The goal is to offer members and the wider public the opportunity to meet and share their passion for the Marque/Brand and, in 2025, to celebrate the 40th Anniversary of Jaguar's win with the V12 XJS in the 1985 James Hardie 1000 at Bathurst and the 50th anniversary of the launch of both the production Jaguar XJS and Jaguar's elegant pillarless Coupe, the XJ-C.

Accommodation

Rydges Mount Panorama Hotel, on the Track at Mount Panorama is the Headquarters for the 53rd Jaguar National Rally

It will be the focus of many of the Rally events. The Hotel has extensive views over The Track and beyond to Mount Panorama. It has a restaurant, function rooms and facilities including kitchenettes in each room and undercover parking.

Access to the Hotels

- Once in Bathurst, follow the signs to Mt Panorama. William Street is a major central CBD street and travelling south will take you to the Track past the National Motor Museum. Rydges is close to the corner of Pit Lane and Conrod Straight.
- Littomore on Stewart (formerly Mantra) and The Heritage Inn are in Stewart Street which is the western boundary of the Bathurst CBD.
- Littomore Suites Bathurst is on the northern boundary of the CBD.

Car Wash and Service Facilities

- Car wash facilities should be available at the Hotels. As Bathurst is one of Australia's largest regional cities, a number of commercial car wash facilities are also available in the near vicinity.
- The usual Auto Accessory outlets are also close at hand in the CBD.
- BP Bathurst is located at 257 Stewart Street.
- EV charging is available near the Information Centre in Durham Street. Also, in Havanna Street (near the Railway Station, Howick Street in the CBD, at Abercrombie House and the National Motor Racing Museum.

The Display Day and Concours will be held around Kings Parade, in the Bathurst Town Centre. This is a perfect location to display your prized Jaguar. Kings Parade is surrounded by cafés, restaurants, hotels and shops. Full of flowers, monuments and history, Kings Parade is an important focal point for Bathurst and visitors.

Cars that have booked in for the Display will muster in Register groups in Ray Bant Avenue behind Rydges at 7AM. From there participants will leave in groups of 10 vehicles for the Bathurst Town Centre.

Even if you are only displaying your Jaguar/Daimler on Display Day you must book by paying \$15 per car via the Rally Registration Form. You may also proceed down the form to order Regalia if you wish.

If attending any other National Rally events, delegates must pay the Registration fee plus \$15.00 to display your car.

The Concours is a friendly competition open to all members of any Jaguar Club in Australia. Judges, some of whom are internationally accredited, will also be recruited from other Jaguar Clubs. A simplified judging system will be employed.

The Concours will be conducted near Kings Parade in the heart of Bathurst. It will showcase some of the best maintained cars for all to enjoy.

There are two classes for entry – D'Elegance and D'Etat. Both classes are judged equally on condition and cleanliness. D'Elegance has an extra element for authenticity.

More details will be available to entrants in regard to cleaning facilities, muster details and the short drive to the display area near Kings Parade following registration.

"Westward Ho" 2025 Post Rally Tour Snapshot

The Post Rally Tour has been carefully curated to bring you the very best of the beautiful Central West region in New South Wales. Food, wine, heritage, magnificent landscapes and more. The Central West has it all.

Our route itinerary will take us through some charming old towns and villages, often ignored by time poor travellers, such as Millthorpe which remains largely unchanged since the late 1800s or Carcoar where, in 1863, Australia's first recorded daylight bank robbery took place. We will visit the Japanese Garden Centre in Cowra where the Japanese POW breakout took place in 1944, before inspecting nearby landra Castle, a 57-room mansion built in the early 1900s, and a reminder of the wealth generated by the agricultural industry at the time.

Then it's on to Forbes, well known for its grand heritage buildings and parks as well as a world-class sculpture trail. We leave Forbes for Dubbo via Peak Hill, once a booming gold mining town and still remembered fondly as the "little town with a heart of gold". We will pass through Parkes where we will visit the CSIRO Parkes Radio Telescope, set in the middle of sheep paddocks and immortalised by the iconic movie "The Dish".

We bring our tour to a close in Dubbo. Here we will bid each other farewell on our final day over morning tea at the heritage listed Dundullimal Homestead. Built in the 1840s, the Homestead is one of Australia's oldest and most refined slab houses with a unique collection of colonial furniture and cottage gardens. So why not join us on the 2025 Post Rally Tour from Monday 7th to Saturday 12th April and let your curiosity run wild - there is so much to see and do.

Included: 1 morning tea, 2 lunches, 3 dinners, 4 visit entries, coach Dubbo.





The Post Rally Tour will have a maximum of 50 Delegates. Preference will be given to interstate Delegates.
